

Below left is a picture of the loading area used during the Christmas runs. Riders were given a safety briefing inside then exited the doors at the far end of the brick building which is the Transportation bldg. At rides end the passengers exited through the yellow gate then up the sidewalk in the right hand picture. The third picture shows the area by the iron girder bridge. For Rail Festival, discussions are underway as to where to load and unload passengers. This Transportation bldg area is one option but passengers would likely be in lines by the iron bridge then come down the sidewalk to board the train then exit through the Transportation bldg in a reverse direction from that during the Christmas runs. More discussions are needed and a decision where and how to load to be made later.

Now that Spring is nearing, here are some safety and operational reminders:

Horn signals: ONE horn blast means the engineer has stopped the train. Do not move the train for any reason such as to put it in a "better" spot if you have blown the horn once. People will be getting off! To move forward, give TWO blasts of the horn THEN begin moving. To move backwards, give THREE blasts of the horn THEN begin moving.

No cell phone usage while you are the engineer or conductor – do your job - be safe.

Never try to get on or off of a moving train – **No exceptions**.

Never run the locomotive inside the engine house – Carbon Monoxide is heavier than air and is DEADLY. It will collect in the below ground level of the engine house and you'll die.

Never refuel an engine in the engine house – **gasoline fumes are also heavier than air** and will collect in the below ground level of the engine house and ignite from any spark such as a light switch, refrigerator turning on, or a static electricity spark. **Always refuel outside** and 20 feet away from the engine house. Gas fumes can flow like water along the ground and collect in the engine house.

Some steam engines burn propane (C_3H_6) which is also heavier than air and will also collect in low areas and ignite easily.

Natural gas, which is mostly methane (CH_4), is lighter than air but, when trapped inside a building and cannot dissipate, will also explode if a spark ignites it. Many houses have blown up due to leaking and trapped natural gas – they're on the news quite often.

Never drive the engine into the engine house – stop 10 or more feet away and push it in making sure ALL of the wheels engage the support stand rails. 7695 tends to derail if the support stand is not aligned properly. It weighs 900 pounds – make sure it doesn't fall off.

Below are the gauge panel and hand controller for club loco 7695. This loco is our primary loco for pulling passengers around the track.

New engineers need to be trained on this loco under the guidance of an engineer already trained and experienced on this loco. It is also important that engineers and conductor know and follow the procedures for loading and carrying passengers around the track.
