There has not been any CPR&SS RR activity yet this year so here are some pictures of the track and Park on this page and on the next.

Below left is a picture of the east end of the fiberglass tunnel showing some daylight toward the back. That's not the light at the end of the tunnel that you've heard about all your life – that's where the roof of the tunnel collapsed during construction work last year. It needs to be fixed before we can work inside the tunnel. The tunnel façade could use some rehab. The remnants of the concrete base of the switch that was there still remains. Plans are to lay one track through this tunnel so a switch is not needed here anymore.

Below right is the west end of the tunnel. It could use some rehab also. Shown is one section of track that was inside the tunnel and there is more track buried inside where the roof caved in. The risk of further cave in is not worth trying to retrieve it.





Both pictures above were taken on March 4, 2023 which was a day after the Dayton area received a very heavy rain. Of note is the vertical gap on the right side picture and there was little evidence of high water flow from above. There is a drain above by the 3 foot track and it seems to be doing its job.

At right is the east end of the tube tunnel. It shows some concrete sealing work that the Park has done to address water flow and resulting erosion where the two walls meet. This picture was also taken on March 4, 2023 after the heavy rain two days earlier.



Eagle Update: Based on the eagle's change in behavior, it is believe that one egg was laid on Feb 21, 2023. A second egg may possibly have been laid a day or two later. Typically, they would hatch in about 35 days - Mar 28th.

At right is the watch tower which is still in the grove but is being prepared to be moved. Note the two "I" beams at the base of the house with end plates and lifting holes. The outhouse is also going to be moved. Picture was taken Mar 4, 2023.

Below is the on-going construction of an overpass to provide access to the hillside slide. It will be high enough for the 3 foot gauge train to pass under the walkway and will provide an area where visitors may watch the train pass under.







At left is the extension that was added to the train barn. This picture was taken on March 4, 2023. It looks to be complete. The barn will store the Park's 3 foot gauge train over night.
