

Above are (L-R) Dan C and Jim H replacing ties just west of the engine house. There has been a concerted effort to replace the old wooden ties with new plastic ones so this track section can be returned to service. It is a straighter route and avoids traversing extra switches in the yard.

At right are Bob H and Jim H on the April 11 work day cutting a 2 X 10 to repair a small wood bridge that will be used to protect the track. A large excavator will be brought in to do some work in the Park. These small bridges were used before at the far west end of the track about a year ago during Park construction then but some bridges were slightly damaged.



Below is Engineer Bob H on the April 22 public train run – the second of the year. The conductor is new member Dan C. It was still a bit cold and crowds were light. We started out with a 10 passenger car train but soon put 5 cars on a siding.



Below are (L-R) Jim H and Scott F replacing old wooden ties with new plastic ones on the track near the tarp storage tunnel on April 15. Tie replacement is continuing.



At right is a photo of a Killdeer's nest with three eggs in it. This is the fourth year we have had a nest between our track rails in this same area just west of the engine house. This nest is on our main line and our train runs over it on each passenger trip. Usually the eggs hatch but this year it appears that the mother bird has abandoned the nest possibly due to the heavy rains we have sustained.



Below are (L-R) Bob H, Jim H, Bob S, Howard W, and Dan C putting gravel down in an attempt to protect the track from damage when a large excavator is brought in past here. The excavator has a drilling attachment on its boom and is going to install anchor rods in the new retaining wall farther to the west in this picture. Wooden bridges and plywood sheathing were also put down but the track was still damaged. Some sections may be reparable but some will need replacement.

Steaming bay space will be rented out for steam engines only. No trailer parking overnight at MCC – park your equipment trailers at Coshocton County Fairgrounds.
