Above are Jim H in front and Larry W on their work train ready to go out. That's Jim's electric loco. There's two flat cars with Jim's drills and tools for replacing ties which Jim has been doing for years. Next is Larry's acetylene torch which he and Ken H are going to straighten out some track at the far west end of the track that was damaged by the construction equipment building the 3 foot track.

Below is Engineer Bob H on the Heritage Day (Memorial Day weekend May 28, 2023) public train run. The conductor is Mark F (orange shirt way in the back). We expected a large crowd as in past years but not so this year. The weather was very good so maybe people stayed home for activities there. The crowd did grow later in the afternoon but there was only one full ten passenger car train this day. We expect a lot more during Rail Festival.



Below are four tents that we set up as a dry run for our loading process to be used for Rail Festival. There are stanchions and a rope dividing the sidewalk in half. For this train run, riders waited on the side closest to the building and exited into the Transportation building after the run.



At right is the first waiting area which is at the top of the sidewalk close to the green tents. The Park's plan is to have large tents erected in this area to provide shade for passengers. We had a light passenger turnout on Heritage Day so we did not get a real test of this loading process.



Below is a view looking up the sidewalk. That's Dave O checking things out. Dave is the co-chairman of the Rail Festival event. Recently there was some discussion about modifying the passenger exit route to go up the grassy area just in front of Dave.





Above are Mike and Terry H (pink shirt) on their Shay on the May 13, 2023 public run day. They have brought the Shay to the track numerous times over the last several years. At right Mike has just finished loading more water into the loco and is preparing to continue running. Behind Mike is Bob H as engineer on 7695 and Larry W as conductor. Note that we have shortened the train to just the five blue cars due to the light passenger attendance. Usually we run ten passenger cars.







Above left is Jim H securing new ties on the May 23<sup>rd</sup> work day. Behind him is Howard W placing new ties where an old tie has been removed. Above right is Larry W spraying weeds using a hose and hand wand. Behind the white tank is a wooden frame that holds spray nozzles for spraying the track ballasted areas. There was a lot of activity this work day. Thanks to all who helped this day and other days.

At right is John L's mower after a short time of his mowing during the peak of the cottonwood tree fuzzy seeds flying – it looked like it was snowing. The air intake needed to be cleared off numerous times.
